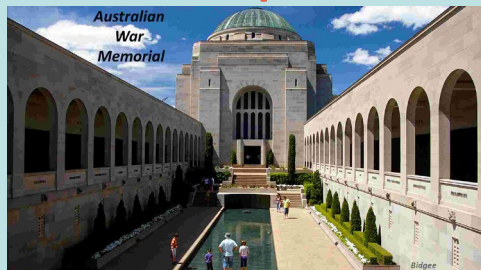

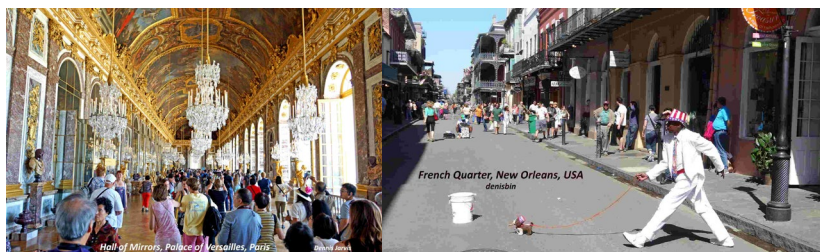
ANZAC Day 25 April

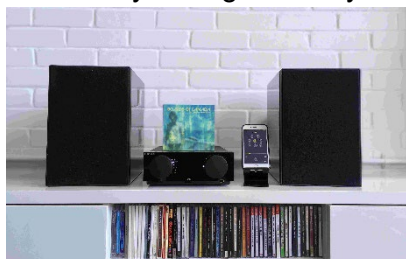

Famous Australians



Col Joye AM was born in Sydney on 13 April, 1937. He first became successful as the lead singer of **Col Joye and The Joy Boys** which included his brothers Kevin and Keith.

In 1959, Col Joye had the following hit songs – **Bye Bye Baby, Rockin' Rollin' Clementine**, and **Oh Yeah Uh Huh**, followed by **Teenage Baby** in 1960.

The band became regulars on Australian TV Shows **Bandstand** and **Six O'Clock Rock**. In 1973, Col Joye released the hit song, **Heaven is My Woman's Love**.

Since founding **ATA Records** in 1966, Col Joye has continued managing the label and in 1988 Col Joye was inducted into the **Aria Hall of Fame**.

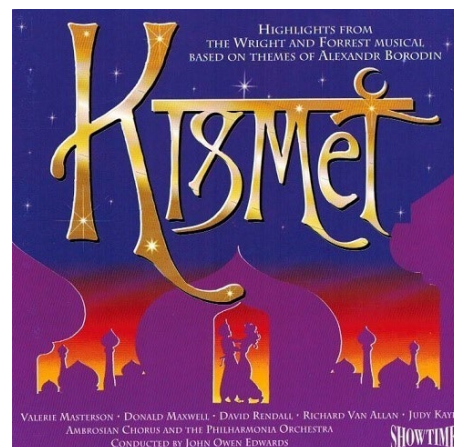
